I still vividly remember how you introduced me to the Lord Jesus after your own encounter from OSCAS Ile Ife, how you always requested that I follow you to the Be-prepared Evangelical Church in Oke-Ayo, Ilesha, from where I also had my own personal encounter with Jesus. For this I'm eternally appreciative. Words may fail me, but I can never forget the impact

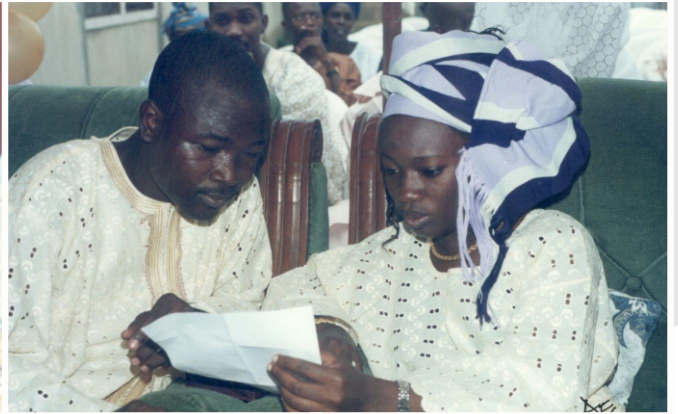

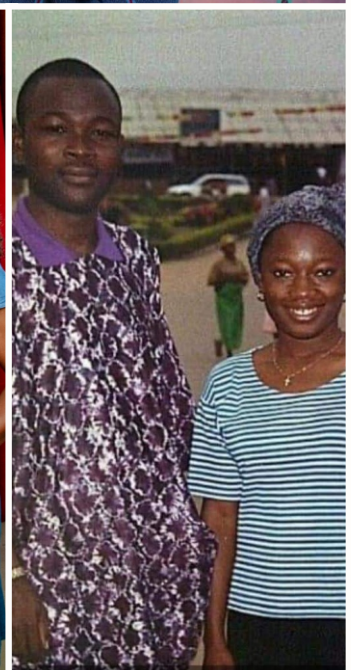
